

OBTAINING TANK LOCKS – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

(Updated March 31, 2022)

Who does this apply to?

Direct-Serve – RORO and CORO Dealers.

In some situations, station operators desire to lock their underground storage tanks. In situations where the station is direct-served by Chevron, commercial carriers **must** be able to unlock tanks for product delivery. Therefore, locks utilized by retailers must meet Chevron's specifications for the delivery area.

Are fuel tank locks required?

No. As most Chevron stations operate 24 hours per day, Chevron does not require the use of storage tank fuel locks. For stations that do not operate 24 hours per day, it is reasonable to use tank locks; however, Chevron does not require the use of a lock. Station operators must operate in full compliance with all laws and regulations. In situations where a legal requirement mandates the use of tank locks, Chevron approved tank locks must be utilized.

Who pays for the tank locks?

Station operators choosing to use tank locks are responsible for purchasing the locks.

Who are the locks purchased from?

Chevron-approved "Best Locks" can be purchased from the vendors listed below. ***Delivery time is approximately 3 weeks.***

- Master Combination Locks (available online, hardware stores, Home Depot, Lowes, locksmiths, etc.). Locks must be 4-digit combination locks. Combination must be set to the last 4-digits of the station number. Example: Station Number 123456; Combination is 3456.

What is the lock specification?

When ordering tank locks, Retailers should specify Chevron TANK LOCK, PART # 21B772. In addition, the Retailer will need to provide the Key codes listed below, by Terminal. Note, the list below of Terminal-specific Key codes is considered Chevron confidential information and should be shared on a need-to-know basis only. For Terminals not on this list, contact the Terminal Manager to find out the key designation.
